

2022 Poster Contest

Eligibility

The National Conservation Poster Contest is open to kindergarten through twelfth grade students. Artwork entered into the national competition must have been judged in a local or area conservation district sponsored poster contest and a state conservation association or state auxiliary sponsored contest.

There will be judging at the county level for all categories.

2022 Contest Theme

The National Poster Contest theme "Healthy Soil, Healthy Life"

Poster category by grade: K-1; 2-3; 4-6; 7-9; 10-12

The contest is open to public, private or home school students.

The winners from each category will be sent to the state for the state competition.

Contest Rules

The contest rules were created so as not to limit or revise the current rules of local and state conservation poster contests:

At the District level we will accept photographs or scanned copies of the hand drawn posters in a JPEG format and the posters themselves, mailed or dropped off. Photographs must be clear and well framed.

- •Any media may be used, including paint, crayon, colored pencil, charcoal, stickers, paper, or other materials.
- •All posters must be created by an individual student, rather than a team of students. Entry must be contestant's original creation and may not be traced from photographs or other artists' published works.
- •The 2022 Stewardship theme "Healthy Soil, Healthy Life" must be included on the front side of each poster submission to be eligible for the national poster contest.
- Each poster submitted electronically should be named in the following format: **State_Grade Level_Last Name** of the winner.
- Each entry for the contest must be submitted to Cecil Soil Conservation District with an NACD **entry form** to be eligible for judging. The form must be completed and signed by a parent or guardian.

•Although younger students will most likely receive help in planning from parents or teachers, CSCD encourages each student to do their own work. Note: Entries with student handwriting and coloring will score better than those designed, drawn, and colored by adult assistance.

Poster Evaluations

National Poster Contest entries are reviewed based on the following criteria:

- Conservation message (50 percent) (Poster uses correct theme)
- Visual effectiveness (30 percent)
- Originality (10 percent) and
- Universal appeal (10 percent)

Local and state contest awards and sponsors will differ from state to state. Depending on the sponsoring state's conservation association, auxiliary, or agency's preference, the national awards will be presented at a national, regional, state, and/or local conservation ceremony. The winning posters will be featured at NACD's Annual Meeting. Each state conservation association, auxiliary or agency contact will receive notification of the judging results and a news release announcing the winners.
